Participation in the National Fraud Initiative

Choice are required to protect the public funds we administer, and we may share information provided to us with other bodies responsible for auditing or administering public funds in order to prevent and detect fraud.

We are going to participate in the National Fraud Initiative, and will be providing details of individual tenancies so that they can be compared to information provided by other public bodies. This will ensure, for example, that no pensions are being paid to persons who are deceased or no longer entitled and that occupational pension income is being declared when an application for housing benefit is made. Sometimes wrong payments are made of a genuine error. Previous exercises have uncovered instances of elderly tenants receiving too little pension, resulting in the payments to people being increased. These exercises therefore help ensure the best use of public funds.

You do not need to respond to this notice. However, you may be contacted again in the future if the data we hold suggests there are mismatches with data held with other public bodies.
